## **Eligibility**

For Saturday's event players must have been born in 2003,2002,2001 or 2000 and a minimum grade of orange belt (7 Mon/4 Kyu) and for Sundays event the minimum grade is green belt (10 Mon/3 Kyu) and born in the year 1999 or before (u15 1999 & 1998 – u17 1997 & 1996 – u20/+20 1995 & Before). Parents are welcome to accompany their children.

## **Travel**

We will depart Nottingham on Friday 6 April and then travel across France and Belgium to Lommel. For the return journey we will depart Monday 8th after breakfast this will ensure that we arrive at Calais in time for our return crossing. We should arrive back in Nottingham about 9.00pm.

## **Accommodation**

We will be booking a local hostel in either Balen or Overpelt for the duration of our stay; the rooms are normally dormitories with split cells within them all boys and girls will be accommodated in separate dorms.

## **Meals**

Breakfast will be supplied along with the accommodation all other meals and refreshments will need to be purchased by the individual.

## **Passport / E111**

Please remember that you must have a current UK passport to attend this trip. We also require that each attendee has an E111 European Health Insurance Card, forms are available from your local Post Office or you can apply online at <http://www.ehic.org.uk>

## **Insurance**

Travel Insurance will be purchased for all competitors.

**Please note:** There is no insurance cover included for non-competitors in the cost of this trip; travel insurance can be bought quite cheaply from many high street shops and online.

## **Cost**

The total cost of this trip, which includes all of the above, is £130.00 for Notts Squad members (this includes a subsidy of £30.00\* from Nottingham Judo) and £160.00 for any other guests.

A completed booking form for each person attending plus a non-refundable deposit of £30.00 per person is required by Monday 7 November to secure a place on this trip. The final balance will be required by Monday 5 March. All cheques should be made payable to Nottingham Judo.

\*Squad members must have attended at two squad sessions from the last four and must have supported a Nottinghamshire event in 2011 to be eligible for the subsidy.
